Finally, we hosted our annual Christmas Lunch at the Royal Glenora on December 8th. The lunch was oversold as the Industry once again showed its generous support of local charities. We shook things up a bit this year at the Christmas lunch. Although we still raised funds for the E4C School Lunch program, we also requested that guests bring an un-wrapped toy or two for our Christmas Mountain. Overwhelmingly the industry came through as we collected over 250 toys. The sight was spectacular. The gifts were delivered to The Zebra Child Protection Services Centre and were used to give out to the 250 children attending their Christmas party. A table raffle for prizes and coffee cards resulted in \$3,300 being raised for the E4C School Lunch Program. Arlene Thompson, coordinator of the program, indicated that \$3,400 would supply hot lunch for 2,100 children. Amazing that in an hour and a half over lunch we were able to affect the lives of almost 2,500 children in Edmonton. I was proud of our Pond and the industry.

As we look forward to the coming year, we are planning for a Casino Night and our annual Charity Gala, as well as our AGM. Stay tuned for details on these events.


# NEW ARRIVAL
